## **Connecticut Board of Pardons and Paroles Public Attendance at Board Hearing**

Since the hearings of the Board of Pardons and Paroles are normally held in correctional facilities, members of the public who wish to attend those hearings should be aware that their admittance to such a facility is subject to the requirements of the Department of Correction in accordance with state Freedom of Information laws and the decision of the FOI Commission in, Docket #FIC 95-366, Inside-Out: Citizens United for Prison Reform, Inc. vs. Board of Parole. Specifically, members of the public must submit their names and date of birth in writing, at least 24 hours in advance to prison officials so that a criminal background check may be conducted. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in a denial of admission to the hearing.
