Dec. 25, 1923. Report from W. G. Taylor, 22 Garden Place, Derby, Conn. that he ran across a number of very thrifty looking & entirely blight free trees on farm. Some years ago Japanese? chestnuts were grafted onto native trees.

Apr. 11, 1924. W.G. Taylor encloses following report from Mrs. Katherine C. White, Marble Dale, Conn.: also sent some nuts. More than 200 grafts made more than 30 yrs. ago & all doing nicely until the blight came. "Now young trees are growing up beside the old stumps & probably will be the native nuts again!" Several varieties used for grafting- The paragon or Spanish chestnut, Numbo, Ridgeley, Japanese. Taylor said he would find out all about these trees the coming summer.
