

Stump sprouts from these 2 trees are now back again to nearly 20 feet in height and both groups of stump sprouts are bearing nuts and without further attacks from the blight.

"All other chestnut trees sent me are dead or dying with the blight. Labels have been lost and I cannot report excepting for the general end result.

"Nuts borne by my 3 trees of *C. moll.* are a little larger than those of the American sweet chestnut, but nearly, if not quite as good in quality."
