Report on Chestnut on Saddle Back of Old Camp Eight:

Today the chestnut on the saddle was trimmed and the following report I feel would be in order.

Many trees are dead of what seems to be American Chestnut Blight. Samples of the various strains are bundled and tagged for your inspection.

The following table might be of interest and filed for future checking. One twig marked so, was one tagged by Boyle to watch. The tree was still alive but the twig was dead.
