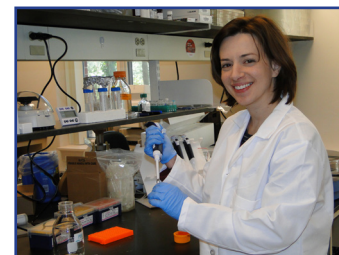

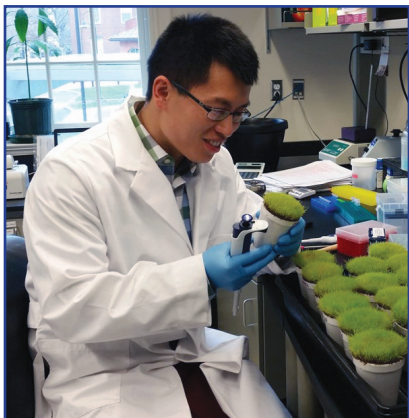

There is a unique institution in Connecticut where there are interesting job opportunities for men and women, who are interested in enhancing their scientific backgrounds.

The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station, founded in 1875, is devoted to research in agriculture, public health, forestry, environment, and to testing food and other materials for unwanted chemicals.

The Experiment Station has a staff of about 92 men and women, most of whom work in offices, laboratories, field sites, and greenhouses. The main campus is located at 123 Huntington Street, New Haven, near Whitney Avenue. Some employees are assigned to the Experiment Station's Valley Laboratory in Windsor, while others work at research facilities in Hamden and Griswold. In addition, about 50 summer research assistants are employed annually to work with scientists in the field and laboratory.
