Pharmacist Continuing Education Requirement

15 credits per calendar year (January 1st thru December 31st)

- 1 credit or contact hour = 0.1 CEUs
- 5 credits of the 15 credits must be obtained at a live presentation
- 1 credit of the 15 credits must be on the subject matter of pharmacy law or drug law

Please Note:

- This credit may be on the subject matter of federal pharmacy or drug law and/or any state's pharmacy or drug law.
- This credit may be either written or live.

The Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy accepts the following accreditations:

ACPE CME

CNE State Board of Pharmacy

- CME, CNE and State Board of Pharmacy programs are considered live programs 99.9% of the time.
- ACPE programs may be live, written or a combination of both.
 - o ACPE Universal Program Numbers ending in:
 - -L are considered live credits.

i.e. 106-000-06-020-L01

■ -H are considered written credits.

i.e. 106-000-06-020-H01

 -C__ are considered to be a combination of live and written credits. It is the program provider's responsibility to differentiate between the number of live credits and written credits.

i.e. 106-000-06-020 -C01

If a pharmacist fails to meet and/or cannot meet the continuing education requirement for any reason whatsoever then the pharmacist must submit a written request to the Commission of Pharmacy:

- 01.) detailing why the pharmacist failed to meet or cannot meet the continuing education requirement.
- 02.) asking for:
 - a. an extension to complete the continuing education requirement.
 - b. a waiver for all or part of the continuing education requirement.

Pharmacists must maintain continuing education certificates of attendance for a period of three years.

- Pharmacists <u>have to</u> submit copies of their continuing education certificates of attendance when requested by the Commission of Pharmacy in response to a random audit, license reinstatement, etc.
- Pharmacists <u>do not have</u> to submit copies of their continuing education certificates of attendance upon annual license renewal.
