1. 8:30 AM call to order. (Reminder to everyone to place their cell phones on "silent").

2. Review Minutes of Previous Meetings:

A. Review minutes of meetings of <u>March 9, 2012 and March 30, 2012</u>. After a thorough view by all of these documents, the Board voted, unanimously, to approve the minutes as presented today. <u>March 9, 2012</u> (Bish/Yusza); <u>March 30, 2012</u> (Soter/Bish)

- <u>3. Report from Trade Practice Division: for review by the Board</u>. The Board reviewed this report submitted by the Department and thanked them for the complaint update.
- 4. Appearing before the Board at the Board's Request: none before the Board today.
- <u>5. Request to Appear Before the Board</u>: none before the Board today.
- <u>6. Comments or Concerns of any Person Present Today:</u>

Mr. Vallieres advised all in attendance at today's meeting of the Board general rules and guidelines as they apply to applicants appearing before them for consideration to sit for their respective license examinations. He made reference to the document sent to all applicants by the Department which details specific information the Board is expecting from the applicants in support of their equivalent experience and training in addition to other more general information.

In addition, Mr. Vallieres also made reference to the Boards Outline for Journeypersons which gives the specific hours for related classroom instruction including course curriculums and the required on-the-job training hours for each license type.

(A) Mr. Vincent J. Pietrorazio; Connecticut E-2 License holder requesting consideration of hardship and alternative education/experience for E-1 candidacy in lieu of 2-year Journeyperson tenure; Mr. Pietrorazio explained that he had come before the Board in the past to ask to take the E-1 Examination without first holding an E-2 license. He was told he could not. He explained his current employment history in his family business. His hardship is for the past 35 years his father has held the E-1 license for his business and is now ready to retire. As such, Mr. Pietrorazio needs to obtain his E-1 license as soon as possible to take over his father's position. Mr. Soter noted that in the past, this Board has allowed family members in hardship situations to sit for the Contractor's examination.

The Board approved Mr. Pietrorazio to sit for the E-1 Unlimited Electrical Contractor's Examination. (Soter/Gavin-Kuhn) They advised him that he must first apply to PSI Exams for the E-1 Examination. Once the application is processed and sent back to the Department, he will then be authorized to test by means of the Department's electronic notification to the test vendor to remove the block from his application.

- 7. Review of Applications(s) for Licensure Examination: applicant(s) appearing in person.
- (1) <u>Andreichik, Andrei</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to deny his application to sit for the <u>E-2 Unlimited Electrical Journeyperson's License Examination</u> on the basis of a lack of related classroom instruction and on-the job training hours. (Soter/Halloran)
- (2) <u>Babic, Jr., Ivan</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to deny his application to sit for the <u>E-1 Unlimited Electrical Contractor's License Examination</u> on the basis of a lack of related classroom instruction and on-the job training hours. (Soter/Halloran)
- (3) <u>Basta, Cristian S.</u> C-5 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Basta previously notified the Department that he will reschedule his appearance to the Board's May 11, 2012 meeting.
- (4) <u>Bell, Gregory R.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Bell was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.

- (5) <u>Boehm, Robert S.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Boehm previously notified the Department that he will reschedule his appearance to the Board's May 11, 2012 meeting.
- (6) <u>Borress, Joseph J.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to table his application due to a lack of on-the-job training and pending receipt of a detailed work history from his past employer(s). (Bish/Soter)
- (7) <u>Castromonte, Lener F.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. It was determined that Mr. Castromonte was previously approved to sit for the E-2 Examination. Therefore, the Board voted, unanimously, to approve this applicant to retest. (Halloran/Soter)
- (8) <u>Chaffee, Todd A.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Chaffee was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.
- (9) <u>Cuttell, Darryl H.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Cuttell was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.
- (10) <u>Evans, Jason M.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Evans withdrew his application after his discussion with the Board and it was determined that his application as presented today is incomplete.
- (11) <u>Gardner, Sean H.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. It was determined that Mr. Gardner had completed his apprenticeship in August of 2007 and authorized to take the examination. His employer terminated him in 2008 because he had not passed the exam having taken it twice. He currently works for Tri-City Electric in the field with his boss. Mr. Soter advised the applicant against continuing to work illegally and warned that he will be fined if he is caught and brought before this Board. In addition the Board has asked that Tri- City Electric be turned over to the Trade Practices Division for unlicensed mechanic(s) and un-indentured apprentices. (Soter/Halloran)

The Board also advised the applicant that since he was previously approved to sit for the E-2 Examination he is automatically approved by them to retest.

(12) <u>Hughes, Neville T.</u> - E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Hughes was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.

- (13) <u>Jefts, Andrew J.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. After extensive discussion with the Board, it was determined that the applicant lacked related classroom instruction and therefore, withdrew his application from consideration.
- (14) <u>Johnson, Chadwick M.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to deny his application to sit for the <u>E-2 Unlimited Electrical Journeyperson's License Examination</u> on the basis of a lack of related classroom instruction and on-the job training hours. (Halloran/Soter)
- (15) <u>Koivisto, Rayman M.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted to approve his application. (Bish/Halloran)
- (16) <u>Kondratowicz</u>, <u>Jordon T.</u>- E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to deny his application to sit for the <u>E-2 Unlimited Electrical Journeyperson's License Examination</u> on the basis of a lack of on-the job training hours. (Soter/Munsill)
- (17) <u>Levine, Jeffrey D.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted unanimously to table his application due to a lack of on-the-job training. (Soter/Gavin-Kuhn)
- (18) <u>Petrosky, II, Charles A.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Petrosky notified the Department by E-Mail on April 12, 2012 that he was not able to attend today's meeting due to working on a project out-of-State. He also advised that he will not be continuing to pursue licensing in Connecticut at present. He thanked the Board for their time and apologized for any inconvenience.
- (19) <u>Picard, Charles J.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Picard was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.
- (20) <u>Rekowski, Thomas D.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Rekowski was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.
- (21) <u>Riddick, Joshua J.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board voted to approve his application. (Bish/Yusza) It is noted that Mr. Soter recused himself from participation in the review and vote on this application.

- (22) <u>Routhier, Michael G.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. It was determined subsequent to the mailing of this agenda that this applicant was previously licensed in Connecticut and does not require to be reapproved by the Board to retest.
- (23) <u>Sowa, Theodore L.</u> E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Sowa e-mailed the Department on April 12, 2012 stating that he will not be able to attend today's meeting and needs more time to gather the information being requested of him.
- (24) <u>Sullivan, Jay B.</u> E-1 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. Mr. Sullivan was not present at today's meeting; therefore, the Board took no action on his application.

Mr. Zeisler indicated that he would be willing to change his license type to a C-6 if the Board so recommends. The applicant previously held a Connecticut V-5 license which he let lapse. Mr. Yusza noted that the V-5 license type was antenna installation and repair only and does not compare to the current C-5 license type. Mr. Zeisler has worked for Davenport Electric under the supervision of an E-1 without holding any license type and not being registered as an apprentice. His application also lists him as subcontractor. In addition, he also worked on his own in New York State.

Mr. Yusza made a motion to deny this application based upon a lack of on-the-job training and related classroom instruction. The motion was seconded by Mr. Soter. Mr. Zeisler asked the Board for direction on what he should do next. Based upon his desire to do audio work in addition to his past training, Mr. Vallieres suggested that Mr. Zeisler review the Board's handout for the required on the job training and related classroom instruction for the various license types.

Mr. Soter also added to his previous motion to recommend that Davenport Electric be turned over to Trade Practices for having employed unlicensed mechanic(s) and unindentured apprentices and for listing the same as a subcontractor.

Mr. Kuzmich received an e-mail from Mr. Schmerl dated April 9, 2012 stating that he is withdrawing his application and no longer will pursue the PV-1 license type at present.
