1. 8:30 AM call to order. (Reminder to everyone to place their cell phones on "silent").

2. Review Minutes of Previous Meetings:

A. Review minutes of meetings of <u>April 13, 2012</u>. It was noted that Board Member David Munsill is incorrectly listed as "Journeyman". The minutes shall be corrected and list Mr. Munsill as "Public Member". As such, the Board the Board voted, unanimously, to approve the minutes as corrected herein. (Soter/Bish)

- **3. Report from Trade Practice Division: for review by the Board.** There was no report given to the Board for this meeting.
- **4. Appearing before the Board at the Board's Request:** no one before the Board today.
- **5. Request to Appear Before the Board:** no one before the Board today.
- 6. Comments or Concerns of any Person Present Today:
- (A) <u>Mr. Michael A. Avery</u>; Connecticut E-2 License holder requesting consideration of waiver of remaining time to sit for his E-1 Unlimited Electrical Contractor's Examination.

Mr. Avery has held his E-2 license since April 12, 2011 and is currently unemployed. Mr. Avery noted that he has been working in the field for seven years and has worked for his father in his electrical company. He also noted that a former employer had misfiled his apprenticeship paperwork which resulted in his losing time towards getting his license. Mr. Avery cited this and the current economic climate as reasons to get into business for himself as quickly as possible. He stated that he has potential clients he can do work for that he met while doing electrical work for others but cannot proceed with this until he gets his contractor's license.

Mr. Vallieres noted that the Board has in the past granted time waivers in hardship situations which he defined by past examples. He does not see Mr. Avery's situation as

a true hardship but rather more the desire to move ahead on the system. The Board cited various scenario's under which Mr. Avery can currently work while waiting to complete his two year time period. The Board also cautioned Mr. Avery not to contract for electrical work illegally. As such, the Board voted, unanimously, to deny Mr. Avery's request to waive the remaining time he has left to sit for his Contractor's Examination. (Bish/Soter)

7. Review of Applications(s) for Licensure Examination: applicant(s) appearing in person.

Mr. Vallieres advised all in attendance at today's meeting of the Board general rules and guidelines as they apply to applicants appearing before them for consideration to sit for their respective license examinations. He made reference to the document sent to all applicants by the Department which details specific information the Board is expecting from the applicants in support of their equivalent experience and training in addition to other more general information.

In addition, Mr. Vallieres also made reference to the Boards Outline for Journeypersons which gives the specific hours for related classroom instruction including course curriculums and the required on-the-job training hours for each license type.

Mr. Vallieres also confirmed with the applicant that he was visited in the past by representatives of the Department of Labor at which point he and his employer would have been made aware that his apprenticeship must be renewed.

Mr. Soter made a motion to deny his application based upon a lack of registered hours and also to turn his employer, Matthew A. Tomis over to the Trade Practices Division for employing unlicensed mechanic(s) and un-indentured apprentices. Mr. Soter also suggested to the applicant that his employer register him immediately with the Department of Labor and explained the consequences of not doing so. Mr. Munsill seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

- (A) <u>Evaluation Forms For Continuing Education Course</u>; for the Board's review and information. The Board reviewed this information and thanked the Department for the same.

- (B) Memorandum of Decision concerning Stamm Construction Co., Inc. vs. Department of Consumer Protection, State of Connecticut; Docket CV 85-0301146 S dated September 1, 1988 concerning the installation of plastic conduit piping as it pertains to Electrical Work; for the Board's information. The Board acknowledged this information and thanked the Department for the same.

20. Old Business:

(A) <u>Information regarding Redwood Systems Commercial Lighting Control Network</u>; for the Board's information. This matter addresses questions received by the Department and raises the issue of whether or not the installation of LED lighting requires a license and not low voltage. The people asking the questions want to know what license category is required for this installation type. Mr. Vallieres commented that the work requires an E-1 or E-2 license regardless of the voltage based upon the fact that this is a type of lighting system. The Board is in agreement with Mr. Vallieres.

21. New Business:

- (A) Mr. Vallieres noted that the Regulations have been amended to incorporate the change in the amount of continuing education hours required for electricians to reflect a minimum of four hours and no less than seven making the language consistent with the Statutes.
- (B) Ms. Gavin-Kuhn spoke addressing the OSHA requirements concerning the four hour module replacing the ten hour module as it relates to plumbing and electrical work. She noted that this change is not happening because the ten hour module is implemented by the Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor as opposed to Connecticut OSHA. There has not been any word from the Labor Department Commissioner as to whether Wage and Hour Division of the Department of Labor or Connecticut OSHA develop the curriculum for the new module. Federal OSHA has been basically hands off because they do not have any requirements for a ten hour module.

The four-hour training module for electricians and plumbers became statute in 2011 (initially proposed as SB 480). However, the CT Department of Labor has not assigned either its Wage or Hour Division, or its CONN-OSHA Division to propose a new four-hour module for electricians or plumbers. Electricians and plumbers working in CT on public jobs should still take the OSHA 10 course every 5 years.
