**1. 8:30 AM call to order. (Reminder to everyone to place their cell phones on "silent").** Chairman Vallieres called the meeting to order at 8:33 AM.

### 2. Review Minutes of Previous Meetings:

A. Review minutes of meetings of <u>July 13, 2012</u>. After a thorough view by all of these documents, it was noted by Mr. Soter that Applicant Nicholas G. Gizzi's license type should be listed as "E-2" and not "E-1" as presently indicated. The Board voted to approve the minutes as corrected herein. (Soter/Halloran) It is noted that Mr. Bish abstained from the vote since he was not present at the last meeting.

**3. Report from Trade Practice Division:** for review by the Board. The Board noted that the report was "lean" and had no further coment.

### 6. Comments or Concerns of any Person Present Today:

(1) <u>Walsh, Robert N.</u>- E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training with questions regarding his qualifications and apprenticeship. Mr. Walsh is requesting approval or further direction from the Board to enter an Apprenticeship Program for an E-2 license type. Mr. Walsh noted that he has previously contacted the Connecticut Department of Labor - Office of Apprenticeship Training Division and was declined by them to enroll as an electrical apprentice because he holds an Officer's position at Network Installation Services, Inc.; the company of which he is president. Network Systems has an E-1 contractor in their employ.

Mr. Walsh also is currently license in Connecticut as a T-1 Limited Electrical Contractor. He informed the Board that he is planning to enroll in an Electrical Related Classroom Instruction program through a State -Approved Night School to fulfill the requirements for the E-2 program.

The Board advised Mr. Walsh that his main issue is accruing the required on-the-job training hours and in order to so, he needs to step down as a Company Officer or otherwise divest himself of ownership of the same in order to enroll as an apprentice with Network Systems and work under the supervision of their E-1 license holder. Another option offered by the Board was to work for another company that is registered with the Connecticut Department of Labor - Apprenticeship Training Division. It is noted that both Mr. Vallieres and Mr. Bish recused themselves from the discussion since they are both professional acquaintances of the applicant.

# **7. Review of Applications(s) for Licensure Examination:** applicant(s) appearing in person.

Mr. Vallieres advised all in attendance at today's meeting of the Board general rules and guidelines as they apply to applicants appearing before them for consideration to sit for their respective license examinations. He made reference to the document sent to all applicants by the Department which details specific information the Board is expecting from the applicants in support of their equivalent experience and training in addition to other more general information.

In addition, Mr. Vallieres also made reference to the Boards Outline for Journeypersons which gives the specific hours for related classroom instruction including course curriculums and the required on-the-job training hours for each license type.

### 19. Review of Correspondence:

#### 20. Old Business:

(A) <u>Matter concerning Application of Mr. Peralta, Francis R.</u> - E-2 applicant seeking approval on the basis of equivalent experience and training. The Board, at their meeting held on July 13, 2012, voted unanimously to deny his application to sit for the <u>E-2</u> <u>Unlimited Electrical Journeyperson's License Examination</u> on the basis of a lack of registered on-the job training hours and asked the Department for further investigation of his employment background.

Mr. Kuzmich noted that he received an e-mail from Keri Lamontagne with the State Department of Labor in which states that Mr. Peralta is currently employed by and registered by Omega Electric in Waterbury (Mike Siedel E-1 185969). Prior to being registered with them he was registered with Practical Energy Solutions in Wallingford from 2/11-4/12 who employs Angel Martinez (E-1 183498). Mr. Peralta had worked under Mr. Martinez at a company called Enerlume in Hamden from 2007-2009. Enerlume does not have an apprenticeship program with the Department of Labor. Mr. Peralta was not a registered apprentice during the time he worked at Enerlume. Mr. Martinez stopped working for Enerlume in 2009 and started working for Practical Energy Solutions in 2010.

After extensive discussion, the Board voted to turn Mr. Angel Martinez over to the Trade Practice Division of the Department of Consumer Protection for investigation

regarding potential employment of unlicensed mechanic(s) and un-indentured apprentices. (Soter/Gavin-Kuhn)

(B) Continuation of discussion concerning Northeast Utilities Meter Socket Transfer Switch Policy; for discussion by the Board including E-Mail from Mr. Steven Osuch dated July 19, 2012 regarding Northeast Utilities responses to Homeowner Exemption Law Changes concerning the Generlink product.

Mr. Osuch from Northeast Utilities distributed a revised <u>Meter Socket Transfer Switch</u> <u>Policy</u> to the Board which now incorporates comments and suggestions presented to them at their last meeting by Department Director Mr. Richard M. Hurlburt. Specifically, Mr. Osuch elaborated on the <u>Homeowner Provisions Section</u> of this document which was not included in the previous draft. In particular, Mr. Osuch addressed Mr. Hurlburt's comment which reads as follows;

"The DRAFT policy prohibits the homeowner from doing the work and at the same time has the building code apply (i.e., permit and inspections). Either the utility company has sole jurisdiction and ownership of the Generlink as an optional attachment to their meter <u>or</u> the building code applies along with the licensing laws of the State of CT. (which allows homeowner to obtain permit and perform own work or hire a licensed Contractor)"

Although it is neither the Boards nor the Utility Company's preference, the Policy will not prohibit a customer from performing the work themselves under the applicable exemptions as provided by the State Building Code and licensing laws, However, it was noted that a homeowner performing this task would need to perform this work in a dry/new socket that has not yet been energized, or will need to have the Utility Company de-energize their existing service and remove the meter prior to starting work.

Mr. Osuch also addressed the following comment made by Mr. Hurlburt in his previous review of the policy which reads as follows:

"If the customer owns the Generlink, then the barrel lock exclusive to utility personnel only, can not be in place."

Northeast Utilities does not believe that this is the case since there is already precedence set in their existing company policies. The customer owns the meter socket and the Utility Company can and does barrel lock the customer's meter sockets at present. In addition, although the <u>Meter Socket Transfer Switch</u> is customer owned, the electric service (utility) is provided and regulated by Northeast Utilities. Mr. Osuch stated that he will provide the Board with a final draft of Northeast Utilities <u>Meter Socket Transfer Switch Policy</u> incorporating the outcome of today's discussions

Mr. Vallieres summarized the Board's discussions on this topic noting that their primary function was to determine if any aspect(s) of this proposed policy is considered

licensable work; to which their answer is yes there are. Beyond enforcing that the required work is done in accordance with all State Laws and Regulations, other information provided by them are suggestions to the policy. The Board advocated the installation portion of the Meter Socket Transfer Switch Policy not cite specific sections of OHSA but instead make note to comply with all their applicable standards leaving the Utility Company with less exposure to potential problems in the future. Mr. Bish also suggested that perhaps the policy can make a recommendation that properly licensed individuals be used on all aspects of the installation beyond just those areas where it is required by law.

Mr. Vallieres noted that in general terms, use of this Transfer Switch is not the Board's first preference. The Board has asked that Northeast Utilities keep track of the device installations and ensure that installation of the same will be in accordance with their (Northeast Utilities) policy. Mr. Vallieres also thanked Mr. Gary Boughton, Building Official from the Town of Bethel, for his input at today's meeting and asked that he please communicate the information gathered today to others in his profession.

In conclusion, Mr. Vallieres again thanked Mr. Osuch and Northeast Utilities for requesting the Board's involvement in establishing their <u>Meter Socket Transfer Switch</u> <u>Policy</u>. Further, he noted that it is the Utility Company's responsibility to communicate this information to the Office of the State Building Official who in turn, will then distribute the same to all the local Building Officials.
