**1. 8:30 AM call to order. (Reminder to everyone to place their cell phones on "silent").** Chairman Vallieres called the meeting to order at 8:31 AM.

#### 2. Review Minutes of Previous Meetings:

A. Review minutes of meetings of <u>October 12, 2012</u>. After a thorough view by the Board, the minutes were approved as submitted. (Bish/Soter)

**3. Report from Trade Practice Division:** for review by the Board.

The Board was advised that the Department has not received a Report from Trade Practices to date.

## 4. Appearing before the Board at the Board's Request:

(A) Mr. Vinnie Valente was introduced as the new *Apprenticeship Program Manager* with the *Office of Apprenticeship Training, Connecticut Department of Labor* and is replacing Mr. Jack Guerrera. It was noted that he will be in attendance at future Board meetings along with Ms. Keri Lamontagne. The Board welcomed him and thanked both he and Ms. Lamontagne for their attendance.

#### 5. Request to Appear Before the Board:

(A) Mr. Danilo Cantil; requesting information regarding his work experience abroad relative to his qualifications to sit for the E-2 Unlimited Electrical Journeyperson's Examination. Mr. Cantil addressed the Board that he came to the U.S. in June of 2002, he was a registered Electrical Engineer in the Philippines for approximately 13 years for a telecommunications company and has done electrical work there on the side on a subcontract basis. He seeks guidance from the Board as to whether his experience as it stands will qualify him to sit for the E-2 Examination without having to complete an apprenticeship program in the U.S.

Ms. Gavin-Kuhn advised this applicant that he must be a registered apprentice for two years in Connecticut with a firm that employs an E-1 license holder. She suggested that he speak with the Department of Labor for further guidance. Mr. Vallieres advised Mr.

Cantil that it is very difficult for the Board to evaluate his credentials without having an application and the associated supplemental documentation before them. Mr. Vallieres suggested that Mr. Cantil decide whether or not to submit an application knowing the qualifications before him and keeping in mind that the fee for such is non-refundable. Mr. Soter stated that from what he has heard today, it sounds as if the applicant may have the required related classroom instruction but lacks the on-the-job training. Mr. Soter suggested that perhaps Mr. Cantil can find an employer and get registered as an apprentice.

Mr. Vallieres again stated that the Board needs an application before them to further proceed in their evaluation and recommendations to this applicant. On behalf of the Board, he wished Mr. Cantil the best of luck in his pursuits.

- 19. Review of Correspondence:
- (A) <u>Evaluation Forms For Continuing Education Course</u>; for the Board's review and information. The Board reviewed the evaluation forms, in detail, and thanked the Department for the same.
- (B) Letter to Ms. Jill E. Walsh, Esq., dated October 15, 2012, from Mr. Richard M. Hurlburt, Director, Occupational and Professional Licensing regarding electrical licensing; for the Board's information. Ms. Walsh is an attorney represents a staffing company specializing in applications, infrastructure, and communications technologies. Mr. Hurlburt stated that this matter had been around for a while and the Commissioner assigned it to him for a response. Mr. Hurlburt noted that her client wants to supply

labor for various jobs and asks whether the labor force requires electrical licensing in the State of Connecticut. Mr. Hurlburt's response is that the only labor the company can supply are Connecticut licensed employees. The law is very clear that an employer cannot <u>hire</u> unlicensed workers to perform electrical work in Connecticut and, in addition, they also cannot <u>supply</u> unlicensed personnel. Mr. Hurlburt also noted that this attorney most likely contacted his Department first and didn't like the answer they got so they went to the Attorney General's Office for their opinion.

#### 20. Old Business:

No items were discussed.

#### 21. New Business:

(A) <u>Governor's Executive Order No. 22</u> was discussed by the Board. This document is a declaration of civil preparedness issued by the Governor due to the threat of Hurricane Sandy. The Order temporarily waived registration requirements for Public Service Technicians who are properly credentialed to perform such work by a State other than Connecticut provided that such individuals engage in such electrical work as their usual employment in that State.

Mr. Hurlburt noted that the Governor's Office had apparently tried to contact him unsuccessfully by cell phone. He stated that, in his opinion, the problem with this declaration was that it waived customer premise wiring which can lead to greater issues. He questioned why there was any waiver issued since utility companies are already waived from licensing up to the demarcation point where the customer's electric service begins. The Board was given excerpts from the law at today's meeting concerning these existing exemptions Mr. Hurlburt fears that this order, which is so broad in nature, may set a precedent for other situations in the future.

- (B) Mr. Vallieres stated that the Department of Labor and the Department of Consumer Protection together in a joint effort inspected a major jobsite in Danbury, Connecticut. The inspectors found many unlicensed individuals working. The investigation is ongoing and Mr. Vallieres asked the Board for their opinion as to whether this matter, which is of great magnitude, come before the Electrical Board <u>prior</u> to the Department making any final decisions. The Board agrees with their Chair and voted unanimously to ask the Commissioner to have this matter come before them at the appropriate time. (Soter/Munsill) Mr. Vallieres offered to communicate with the Commissioner.
- (C) Mr. Vallieres noted that the Board held a Special Meeting on Friday, October, 26, 2012 solely for the purpose of reviewing submissions made by providers of continuing education for electricians for the 2012 2013 license year.
