Important Information

- A picnic area is available for lunch outside of the grounds. This area is open to the public and is first come first serve for seating. We cannot accommodate lunch inside the museum.
- The grounds are primarily outdoors, and the mine is consistently cold and wet. Please plan / dress accordingly.
- There are restrooms available in the visitor center. If you are visiting with a group of students please monitor the bathrooms to efficiently get the students through.

Prison Yard Information

- There are many rock walls and ruins, please refrain from climbing on anything. Both feet must remain on the ground.
- As an archaeological preserve all objects (including rocks) must be left on the site.
 Please take nothing but photographs.
- Our staff is very knowledgeable about New-Gate's history, but they are also trained to keep visitors safe, please listen and respect their authority.

Mine Information

- The mine is 33 steps down and consists of a 100 yard loop, strollers, wheelchairs, walkers, and similar devises are not permitted.
- The mine is 52 degrees, wet, dimly lit and has uneven footing, closed toed shoes are required.
- The elevation changes from 35 feet to 75 feet below ground, please watch your head at all times.
- The mine is not an experience that everyone enjoys, please consider your medical history and physical limitation before deciding to tour the mine.
- The mine can only be experienced with a guide, and children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult.
