

**NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE A GENERAL PERMIT
NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING
For a General Permit to Construct and/or Operate Certain New or Existing
Emergency Engine or Distributed Generation Resource and to Revise the State
Implementation Plan for Air Quality**

I. Introduction

Pursuant to section 22a-174(l) and 22a-6 of the Connecticut General Statutes and section 102(a) of Public Act 07-242, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection (Commissioner) hereby provides notice of intent to issue a General Permit to Construct and/or Operate New or Existing Emergency Engine or Distributed Generation Resource (general permit). The Commissioner also hereby provides notice of intent to revise the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for Air Quality. Upon issuance, the general permit will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for their review and approval as a revision to the SIP as required by the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 (CAA). This general permit will cover the construction and operation of new or existing emergency engines and distributed generation resources of up to two megawatts (MW) available to operate on or before December 1, 2007 for purposes of participation in a pilot program developed by the Department of Public Utility Control (DPUC) specified in section 103 of [Public Act \(PA\) 07-242, An Act Concerning Electricity and Energy Efficiency](#).

The Department will hold a status conference on October 16, 2007 at 2 P.M. in the Russell Hearing Room on the 3rd Floor of the Department of Environment Protection offices at 79 Elm Street in Hartford, Connecticut. Persons interested in participating in the public hearing may attend. The public hearing will be held on November 9, 2007 at 10 A.M. in the Russell Hearing Room on the 3rd floor of the Department of Environment Protection offices at 79 Elm Street in Hartford, Connecticut.

II. General Permit Overview

As required by section 102(a) of Public Act 07-242, the general permit will authorize the construction and operation of new or existing emergency engines and distributed generation resources that (1) generate no more than two megawatts of electricity; and (2) are approved by the Department of Public Utility Control to participate in the markets administered by the regional independent system operator in accordance with section 103(b) of Public Act 07-242. The provisions of the general permit include, but are not limited to: minimum setback provisions, limitations on hours of operation, requirements for air pollution controls certified to achieve a minimum reduction in emissions of nitrogen oxides of ninety percent, directionally correct offsets at a ratio to be determined by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, required control equipment, requirements for monitoring, reporting and recordkeeping, and any other requirement that said commissioner deems necessary.

The general permit shall expire no later than December 31, 2010 or ninety days after the energizing of the Middletown-Norwalk 345 kv transmission line approved by the Connecticut Siting Council. An emergency engine approved by Department of Public Utility Control pursuant to section 103 of Public Act 07-242, shall operate under the general permit and no longer be eligible for coverage under sections 22a-174-3a or 22a-174-3b of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies.

On November 9, 2007, the Commissioner shall hold a public hearing on this general permit. Such hearing shall be held at the Department of Environmental Protection, 79 Elm Street, Hartford, Connecticut in the Russell Hearing Room at 10a.m. The hearing shall be preceded by a status conference for all parties who are interested in participating as interveners on October 16, 2007. The status conference shall be held at the Department of Environmental Protection, 79 Elm Street, Hartford, Connecticut, in the Russell Hearing Room at 2 p.m.

Pursuant to provisions of General Statutes § 16-52m and Section 16-50j-32 of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies, notice is hereby given that the Connecticut Siting Council (CSC) will conduct a public hearing on Wednesday, November 7, 2007, beginning at 2:00 p.m., and continued at 4:30 p.m., at Hearing Room, Three Two Franklin Square, New Britain, Connecticut, (860) 237-2935 and thereafter as necessary. The hearing will be held pursuant to Public Act 07-242, An Act Concerning Electricity and Energy Efficiency, Sections 8 and 54.

The purpose of the hearing is to hear evidence of any party with convictions that, pursuant to Section 54 of Public Act 07-242, (C.G.S. § 16a-70d), as amended, the Connecticut Siting Council (CSC) and the Department of Public Utility Control (DPUC) may act to exempt certain facilities from the requirements for proposal (RFP) process (administered by the Connecticut Energy Advisory Board (CEAB)) and municipal participation fee requirements.

Section 54 of Public Act 07-242 reads in relevant part:

"Any facility generating not more than five megawatts and any electric transmission line, structure or facility, or electric supply or otherwise constituting a facility as described in subsection (a) of section 16-50j that, as part of the proceeding conducted pursuant to section 54 of this act and in accordance with this subsection, shall be determined by the Connecticut Siting Council to be exempt from the RFP process shall be required for the reliability of electric supply to critical national defense and homeland security infrastructure shall be exempt from the RFP process described in this subsection and exempt from the municipal participation fee requirements of subsection (1) subsection (2) of section 16-50j, as amended by this act. Such determination shall be made on or before December 31, 2007."

The hearing is held in conjunction with Section 8 of Public Act 07-242, which reads, "Not later than September 1, 2007, the Connecticut Siting Council, in consultation with the Emergency Management and Homeland Security Coordinating Council, established pursuant to section 25-1b of the general statutes, and the Department of Public Utility Control shall initiate a completed case proceeding, in accordance with the provisions of chapter 54 of the general statutes, to investigate energy security with regard to the siting of electric generating facilities and transmission facilities, including consideration of planning, preparedness, response and recovery capabilities. The Connecticut Siting Council may conduct such proceedings in an expedited manner with sensitive information submitted under a protective order." Hearings in relation to section 8 and Section 54 of Public Act 07-242 are under a single docket number, 346.

This hearing session will provide parties, and intervenors an opportunity to cross-examine opponents and offer rebuttal evidence. The Council will also conduct post-hearing briefs.

I. Introduction

Pursuant to section 22a-174(a) and 22a-5 of the Connecticut General Statutes and section 102(a) of Public Act 07-242, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection (Commissioner) hereby provides notice of intent to issue a General Permit to Construct and/or Operate New or Existing Emergency Engine or Distributed Generation Resource (general permit). The Commissioner also hereby provides notice of intent to revise the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for Air Quality. Upon issuance, the general permit will be submitted to the United States Environmental Protection Agency for their review and approval as a revision to the SIP as required by the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 (CAA). This general permit will cover the construction and operation of new or existing emergency engines and distributed generation resources of up to two megawatts (MW) available to operate on or before December 1, 2007 for purposes of participation in a pilot program developed by the Department of Public Utility Control (DPUIC) specified in section 103 of Public Act (PA) 07-242, An Act Concerning Electricity and Energy Efficiency, <http://www.cga.ct.gov/2007/2007act/PA/PA-00242-R001B-07-242-PA.htm>.

II. General Permit Overview

As required by section 102(a) of Public Act 07-242, the general permit will authorize the construction and operation of new or existing emergency engines and distributed generation resources that (1) generate no more than two megawatts of electricity; and (2) are approved by the Department of Public Utility Control to participate in the markets administered by the regional independent system operator in accordance with section 103(b) of Public Act 07-242. The provisions of the general permit include, but are not limited to: minimum setback provisions, limitations on hours of operation, requirements for air pollution controls certified to achieve a minimum reduction in emissions of nitrogen oxides of ninety percent, directionally correct offsets at a ratio to be determined by the Commissioner of Environmental Protection, required control equipment, requirements for monitoring, reporting and record-keeping, and any other requirement that said commissioner deems necessary.

III. Review of the Draft General Permit and Public Participation
