Completion Certificates to Clients

The purpose of this guidance is to instruct agencies of a change in policy regarding the distribution of completion certificates to clients. This guidance pertains to all CT WAP Weatherization programs.

Completion Certificates to Clients

Due to recommendations by the Department of Energy and Quality Work Plan requirements, CT WAP is requiring agencies to provide a copy of the Completion Certificate to the client at the time of inspection. This copy must be in agreement with the copy that is in the file, therefore anything that is handwritten on the on-file completion certificate must **also** be written on the completion certificate given to the client. **Both the inspector and the client must sign both copies of the document**.

Clients who receive a copy of a completion certificate tend to be more aware of the measures that were installed in the home, and more educated about the potential energy savings that will result from these measures. This also allows for agencies to work with the client to show the energy efficiency measures that were done to the home.

Monitors will be asking clients to produce a copy of this certificate for all jobs inspected and submitted as completed DOE WAP units to CT WAP. Agencies will be cited after this point, should this procedure not be followed. It is not expected that agencies should retroactively perform this measure.
