"The production [of] revenues sufficient to provide for the support of the authority and its operations on a self-sustaining basis" CGS § 22a-269(a):

"Subject to the approval of the Treasurer of the state, and any other limitations of this chapter, the authority may borrow money and issue its bonds or notes from time to time and use the proceeds thereof for the purposes and powers of the authority and to accomplish the purposes of this chapter..."

Note: CRRA funds its education programs through its operating revenues as well as through grants, contributions and user fees.
