






Aluminum & Tin Cans	A11	All metal food & beverage containers

Food Scraps	Commercial	If generate 104+ tons/year source separated organic material, & located within 20 miles of permitted recycling facility that can accept that material, must ensure materials composted.

HDPE	A11	Containers 3 gallons or less

Ni-Cad Batteries	A11
