Outreach & Enforcement Initiative, Background

Through formal enforcement action in 2003, funds that were generated through an SEP were used to create an outreach program.

<u>Phase One</u>

- 1. To gather baseline data in 2004, DEEP sent out a questionnaire to all Auto Salvage Yards in the state (approx. 125). 50 surveys were returned.
- DEEP hosted 4 training sessions (held January 2004-September 2004). Guidance Manual was distributed - <u>Auto Recycling</u> <u>Industry Compliance Guide.</u>
- Follow up questionnaire sent out to training session attendees.
 20 surveys were returned.
- 4. A consultant was hired to analyze data received.

Follow-up activity

<u>Phase Two</u>

- DMV inspectors have received ongoing training in a waste, water, pollution prevention, and air developed compliance checklist.
- 2. From 2005-2014 107- multimedia inspections were conducted by waste and water.
- B. Enforcement was taken where necessary.

Common RCRA Violations

- Lacking used oil total halogen determination
- Failure to mark universal waste (batteries, lamps)
- Lacking hazardous waste determinations
- Incorrect storage of used batteries
