2019 Annual Municipal Recycling Report (AMRR)

- Towns were notified in August 15, 2019
- Deadline extended to October 30, 2019
- Some municipal contact information needed updating, deadline extensions available
 - Outdated Recycling Coordinator Info
 - Unresponsive/Absent Municipal Contact
 - Email bounce, system issues, opt-out...



2019 Annual Municipal Recycling Report (AMRR)

- Parts 1-5 provide information on municipal collection, facilities, transport and disposal
- Part 6 supports both municipal and DEEP in assessing issues such as statutory compliance, costs, collection programs, waste reduction initiatives, education, and public information programs



Benefits of the AMRR to Municipal Programs

- Generates "apples-to-apples" data for comparison to other municipalities
- Basis for public policy decisions
- Can be used for public information programs
- Assists in creating a model of the municipal trash and recycling program, along with standard metrics



Benefits of Good Data to a Municipal SMM Program

- Identifies areas of potential cost savings
- Central to transparency for municipal government, residents, and current/potential contractors
- Allows evaluation of waste reduction and cost reduction programs when tracked over time
- Provides linkage to DEEP SMM Program
 Support



ReTRAC/Recycling Partnership Municipal Measurement Program

- The Municipal Measurement Program (MMP) launched in January 2019 with the goal of harmonizing the measurement of material management programs and providing municipalities with decision-making tools that can improve recycling program performance.
- The MMP is a Program Assessment and Planning Tool providing participating municipalities with access to powerful analytical reports designed to measure waste diversion performance and improve programs.



Municipal Measurement Program

Municipal Measurement Program

- US and Canada Municipal Solid Waste Data
 - single-family & multi-family recycling, MSW, and organics curbside and drop-off collection program
- Built in analytics and recommendations
- Comparison to other communities
 - MSW Generation
 - Recyclables/Diversion
 - Costs
- Tracking MSW and Recyclables over Time



Municipal Measurement Program

- Provides a third-party tool for generating common metrics between municipalities
- MMP Data is similar or identical to data reported to DEEP under the AMRR Program (public and non-confidential)
- Municipalities can go further to take advantage of other MMP tools/benefits
