







WEED inspected approximately 100 facilities





REI: Field Results

70% of Sites inspected had Designated Recycling Violations





Typical Violations Identified

1. Limited Recycling:

a)Site recycled only one or a few designated recyclable items

- For example, some Retail or Manufacturing facilities recycled cardboard or scrap metal only
- No recycling provided for other items, such as, bottles, cans, newspapers, magazines or office paper

2. Mixing of recyclable items:

- a)Site may have had a recycling program in place, but more than an incidental amount of designated recyclable material was combined with trash
- b)Several multi-tenant sites had a significant recycling program in place, however, maintenance workers had been removing redeemable cans/bottles and then discarding the remaining designated recyclables into the trash



Typical violations Encountered (cont'd)

3. No Recycling Program at all:

- MSW Contracts do not include the collection of designated recyclable items
- No internal collection containers associated with recycling
- No external collection containers associated with recycling
- No facility staff designated or responsible for recycling
- For the multi-tenant housing sector: No outreach/education provided to tenants





REI Actions to Date

NONs issued to 2 Sites

- Identifies violations
- Provides formal notice to facilities of recycling requirements
- Does not require a formal response

NOVs issued to over 40 Multi-Tenant Housing Sites (Hartford & New Haven)

- Early in the process, but a few have responded well thus far by implementing Recycling Programs
 - Installed collection containers (internally & externally)
 - Expanded collection contracts with Solid Waste Haulers to include collection of recyclables
 - Provided outreach/education to tenants
 - Developed and implemented SOPs to ensure recyclables remain segregated
- Those that fail to adequately respond will be assessed to determine the need for an escalated action, consistent with the ERP, which may include civil penalty.





REI Actions to Date

Compliance Assistance has been provided to Multiple Sites

Most have been closed out, but a few have not responded adequately and will be discussed to determine the next course action (ERP):
