


- Self Determination:
- On-Site Staff take measurements using Gamma Ray Spectroscopy instrument
- E-mail spectrum to CT DEEP Radiation
- We evaluate it during regular work hours.



- Refuse the load- Contact DEEP Radiation
- We write up a US DOT Exemption
- We E-Mail or FAX it back to you
- Send load away
- Done during normal work hours

Time Commitment




- DEEP Radiation will no longer be dispatching after end of this June.
- Will continue to dispatch under certain conditions-
- Dose rates > 50 mrem/hr on contact with the vehicle
- Non-medical Isotope determined



Continue to Reiterate to Medical Community the importance of patient awareness
