Joel Severance: The following report was provided by Joel Severance:

- New Haven will be conducting a Basic Training Class in the Fall
- R2SART is scheduling several training classes including small Animal 1st Aid
- We are working with the new Fire Chief in East Haven on starting up a CERT team
- VSEMA Participated in an Active Shooter Training Class
- DART
 - Local Lions Club presented us a fuel powered heater for large animal rescue.
 - Responded to a structure fire with Durham & Middlefield Fire Depts. to check on some dogs that experienced smoke inhalation.
 - Rabies Clinic scheduled for June.
- Hamden CERT has done the following:
 - Community Outreach in works for meeting (presentation of success)
 - Completed Basic CERT Training Class
 - Completed Teen CERT Basic Training Class
 - CERT Therapy K9 Demonstration
- UNH
 - Advanced degree now offered.....There has been a large request for the Fall Semester Class
 - Traveling to DHS and Emmitsburg
 - Had one activation to search for missing student

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- We had a class of 8 graduated in April.
- Milford
 - Milford Fire Department EMTs gave a presentation to all of the Milford CERT/MRC volunteers on what to do if you find yourself in a possible life threatening situation. The presentation was based on a recent news article from the Associated Press entitled “Ordinary people trained to save lives in shootings, attacks...”
 - Community Outreach: Milford Health Department has collaborated with Yale University to develop a survey for volunteers to determine their willingness to participate in a neighborhood ambassador program.

Region 3 Update:

Don Davis/Harley Graime:

- DEMHS’s Bob Scata presented a PPT on the 2017 CERT training DVD.
- ESF-16 Update: Bill Perkins reported that the ESFs over ESF 16 (to 21) are being placed in other ESF designations to conform to the national ESF designations.
- CREPC and RESF 16 are now part of RESF-6, Mass Care headed by Jon Basso of the ARC.
- CERT Ambassador Program gave a discussion at the Wolcott and Southington Senior housing facilities and also at the New England Carousel Museum combining that one with business resilience and preparedness.
- Funding Requests:
 - Category A: Middletown/Southington for training
 - Category D: Ellington/Bristol/Newington/S. Windsor/Manchester for flashlights
- Regional Preparedness Committee met at end of April. They are looking for a location to hold their field day on Saturday 9/9/17. The training will hopefully contain a shortened combined training session. The group will meet again on June 7, 2017 unless a venue is booked prior to that.

Region 4 Update:

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Region 5 Update:

Paul Gibb:

- A traffic control class for CERT members was held on April 26, 2017 at the Torrington Fire Department.
- A POD training class was held for CERT members on May 17, 2017.
- A CPR/AED class is scheduled for June 21, 2017 at the Torrington Fire Department.

Joanna Rogalski: No Report

CEMA (Don Janelle):

- Attended FEMA Region 1 Webinar hosted by Arlene
- Requesting that this group be added to the mailing list for this webinar
- Working on Public Safety/emergency management legislation

MRC (Katherine McCormack):

- There are 23 officially recognized MRC units in CT.
- MRC Unit leaders continue to participate in monthly MRC Well Check conference calls. The most recent calls were April Well Check which included the 2017 MRC and NACCHO Outstanding MRC award winners based on nominations submitted by a variety of sources.
- MRC regional meetings continue to be held on a regular basis and participants share training and exercise opportunities as well as ideas for recruitment and retention.
- Katherine McCormack continues to attend and participate in the CT Citizen Corps Council monthly meetings representing Connecticut's MRC program.
- Many of the MRC activation requests during the last quarter have been in support of public health initiatives in preparation for future POD events, health fairs, Public Access TV, and CT VOST training and deployment.
- The 2017 MRC Challenge Award applications closed mid-December and several CT MRC units applied. There were six CT units awarded funding in 2017. Awards went to Torrington, Pomperaug, Naugatuck Valley, Quinnipiac Valley, Uncas, and Wallingford MRC Units. One of the main focus areas is related to the opioid epidemic.
- The Wallingford MRC bid farewell to Bryan Nagel who was hired as a sanitarian in the North Central Health District.
- Katherine McCormack, CT MRC Liaison, was a VIP guest of Chris Troyanos and the Boston Athletic Association at the 2017 Boston Marathon. Katherine spent the day in the medical operations tent as both an observer and support staff.
- Allyson Schulz, Uncas Health District Preparedness Coordinator, presented at the May 2017 Region 2 meeting. Allyson continues to promote the CT VOST and has the current team activated to support several large CT events. CT VOST in Regions 4 and 3 is becoming a CT MRC Best Practice program.

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V. Old Business:

Distribution of Hats, Lights and Field Guides.

- There are currently 84 CERT Backpack kits
- Discussed which items in the backpack are important and which may need to be changed
- Group would like to implement a CERT poll to EMDs and Team Leaders regarding the CERT backpack.

ICS Forms:

- ICS 211 is incredibly important in tracking hours for federal reimbursement
- It may be important to develop a shortened review of ICS forms to handout to teams that is tailored for CERT, MRC and Fire Corps
- SCCC Council recommends that CERT teams have a working knowledge of these forms and ICS.
- Don Janelle would be willing to teach this course at CERT Weekend.

FFY 2017 Funding Request:

- Extra 10,445 dollars of funding was reprogrammed to the total CERT budget for this fiscal year.
- How do we want to earmark this funding?
 - Mission specific equipment
 - Training Day
 - CSP cursory background checks
 - Backpack purchases (Survey monkey)
 - Stop the bleed tourniquet kit for training

Status of WestCOG and MetroCOG

- There will no longer be planning grants for the towns that are not handled by Norma Peterson
- REPT chair to be kept in loop on CERT related information. Michelle Deluca will receive the same information that Dave Hannon used to receive.

VOST Status Update

- VOST should take all hazards CERT training class.
- Need to have a follow up meeting between DEMHS, DPH and VOST leadership to discuss VOST.

VI. New Business:

Review of 2016 Activity Report

- Did very well with the collection of this data this year. In total, 92 reports have been received. Last year we received 1/3 of the reports.
- This data collected is extremely helpful when asking for funding.
- Improvements to focus on for next year:

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- Need to have standard tracking guidance for teams.
- Guidelines for tracking should be included in the CERT Saturday event and CERT manual.
- Better reporting process.
- Next year's data will be due in January.

FEMA Individual/Community Preparedness Awards.

- Chief Amatrudo would like to nominate the SCC group for an award as the new group has done a lot of work in advancing the SCCC cause in Connecticut.
- Encourage towns to submit application to encourage excitement.

CERT Training Day

- Fire Academy – considering Saturday, 23rd of September
- The group ^{is} looking for input on what people would like in the training process.

Initial CERT Training Course

- EMI Training Opportunities:
 - 2018 Training; Train the trainer opportunities
 - EO 427, EO 428
 - New Training Program, Certificates, etc. Documentation form
 - Citizen corps website, data collection for CERT. this form should be used for all classes going forward.
 - Currently 89 CERT trainers with different forms makes record keeping easier in the long run.
 - Adding or deleting training modules
 - Trainers should not delete training modules
 - Some may not want the gas leak training included in these training modules.
 - Should check any legal ramifications.
 - May add disclaimer, I am required to show you this module, but in Connecticut it is not recommended that CERT members enter a building to shut off a gas leak.

Role of CERT teams during coastal evacuations

- The evacuation taskforce is developing plans for persons who do not have vehicles.
- Temporary evacuation sites with people being bussed out.
- May be beneficial to have CERT team members not on the shoreline trained in assisting in these sorts of evacuations.
- CERT as an available resource when this sort of disaster occurs.
