**The term HIV Infection is used to refer to three categories of diagnoses collectively:**

- (1) persons with a diagnosis of HIV infection (not AIDS)**
- (2) a diagnosis of HIV infection and a later diagnosis of AIDS**
- (3) concurrent diagnoses of HIV and AIDS**
