What the Preliminary Assessment is – and is not

- CGS 25-33g: the WUCC develops a Preliminary Assessment that goes to the public for additional input, and <u>then</u> it becomes the Final Assessment
- RCSA 25-33h-1[(d)(2)(A)]: the Preliminary Assessment must be "factual and concise"
- The Preliminary Assessment should not answer all our questions or make any significant decisions
- The Final Assessment should set the stage for ESA determinations and the Integrated Report
- RCSA 25-33h-1[(d)(2)(C)(ix)]: the **Integrated Report** shall contain "consideration of the potential impacts of the plan on other uses of water resources including water quality, flood management, recreation, hydropower, and aquatic habitat issues"
