Subject: Subsidized Funding Opportunities for the Emergency Power Generators

As a follow-up to Circular Letter 2016-01 dated January 19, 2016 and Circular Letter 2018-13 dated May 18, 2018, the Drinking Water Section (DWS) would like to remind you that you are required to have generator systems capable of operating critical drinking water infrastructure during a power outage installed no later than December 17, 2018 to comply with Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies (RCSA) Section 19-13-b102(w). It is very common that power outages that occur at a community water system (CWS) result in the loss of distribution system pressure, followed by the interruption of water service to the customers. Back-up generator systems prevent such interruptions of service and allow PWS to continue to provide their customers a source of safe water supply for drinking and other important public health needs until normal utility power is restored.

I would also like to remind you that the DWS's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) offers a program to provide subsidized low interest loans for the purchase and installation of permanent stationary stand-by generator systems. Applications for DWSRF funding may be submitted at any time and are requested to be submitted electronically to DPH.CTDWSRF@ct.gov. The DPH encourages you to submit an Eligibility Application as soon as possible if you have not yet installed a generator system to satisfy the regulatory requirement. If your completed application is received prior to December 17, 2018 the DPH will grant you a 12 month extension of time to comply with the requirement via a written Consent Agreement between the CWS and the DPH.
