SUBJECT: Harmful Algal Blooms/ Potential Cyanotoxin Concerns

The Department of Public Health, Drinking Water Section (DWS), in collaboration with the DPH State Public Health Laboratory is continuing in its endeavor to assist surface water public water systems with the presence of Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs) which may contain the presence of two specific cyanotoxins (microcystin and cylindrospermopsin) that are the subject of the Environmental Protections Agency's (EPA) recent health advisory: EPA Cyanotoxin Health Advisory.

All surface public water systems with any concerns regarding HABs may contact the DWS as a limited amount of free testing for cyanotoxins will be offered on a case by case basis by the DPH State Public Health Laboratory.
