Importance of Water Operators

Certified Operators are the Department of Public Health's front line in maintaining the purity and adequacy of the state's public drinking water.

 A well-trained, committed and ethical operator workforce, working to assure regulatory compliance, is essential for the security and safety of our public water supplies.

Ops (holding **132 CT DPH Certifications)** ♦ All certification Types & Class Levels -WT Plant Operators Class I, II, III, IV, CND, OIT -DS Operators Class I, II, III, OIT -SW Operators, CND Operators of CPWS & NTNC of All Sizes & Complexities: -Single well serving 1 building to -Large Municipal Public and Private Public Water Systems that serve several towns (miles of distribution system piping, storage facilities and the most complex treatment plants) **Drinking Water Section**

Operators Whose Certification was Granted Conditionally:

- Operators whose oversight represents a small piece of their day of a CPWS or NTNC serving 25 persons

&

 Operators Who Hold the Highest Treatment Plant and Distribution System Certification Levels (i.e. who have met CT DPH most stringent certification requirements):

- Operators whose oversight represents a full time position for a water utility that serves >400,000 persons

Why We are Here

Requirements:

CT DPH is Required by EPA Requirements to ensure that operators understand (Learn about) the Public Health significance of their work – the impact that their work has upon public health

CT Regulations require operational decisions about water quality or quantity, that affect public health, shall be responsibility of the appropriately CT DPH Certified Operator.

Chief Operators are required to have the direct responsible charge for the operation and maintenance of the PWS

 CT DPH Certified Operators Represent the "Technical Capacity" of PWS Operations
 Your Technical Awareness / Knowledge will:

- ensure that qualified personnel are operating water systems;
- minimize public health concerns;
- develop public trust & confidence in drinking water;
- maximize the performance of the system;
- protect the safety of the operators;
- improve compliance with regulations;
- optimize operation costs;
- protect the system's equipment;
