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Breakout Session Notes

Regionalizaton Discussion – 1/23/2019

Our breakout group discussed EMS regionalization. The group was told about a consulting report being completed by the Holdsworth group for several communities in the Northwest area of the State. The agencies involved with this study appear open to the idea of sharing resources. The draft report will be out by the end of this month. It is likely that this report will provide suggestions for resource sharing among communities experiencing service delivery challenges that could potentially be shared and considered in other areas of the State.

Several reasons for reluctance to sharing service resources were discussed. Anecdotally it is believed that the concept of local control as the preferred business model (a reluctance to give up a local fiefdom) is seen as a primary limiter to greater regionalization discussion.

It was also discussed that agency leadership and municipality leadership are both likely to change regularly in many communities, making progress in these areas difficult to maintain.

A primary alternative to deeper cooperation among agencies is an increased reliance on paying for additional staff or contracting out to another provider agency.
