Old Business:

- 1. Meeting came to order at 10:00 AM.
- 2. (Phil Rusconi) Any changes to the minutes from the 1/16/04 meeting? (Dermot) Items #7, #8 and #15 require some grammatical changes.
- 3. (Phil Rusconi) Any changes to the April minutes?
- 4. (Jeff) #19 needs some changes to more accurately describe the new climate in the state departments.
- 5. (Dermot) Items #6 and #16 also need amending.
- 6. (Phil Rusoni) Motion to accept minutes. Minutes accepted.
- 7. (Jeff) An email was sent to Drinking Water Treatment facilities to alert them of an update on the State Water Department website regarding sampling requirements.
- 8. (Phil Rusconi) We need a summary of State Water Department requirement changes. It is a nightmare to determine what is new.
- 9. (Lucy) Changes are being made to client's schedules by the department without notice, then the client receives an NOV.
- 10. (Phil Rusconi) Setup an agenda item or meeting for Drinking Water Department issues including owners, contract operators, laboratories.
- 11. (Bert) We need subcommittee meetings.
- 12. (Phil Rusconi) I will take the responsibility to arrange a meeting with laboratories who have an interest in drinking water issues. It will include Mike Hage from the Drinking Water Department.
- 13. (Bert) Will be setting up an email tree conversation for the purpose of setting up an agenda for the subcommittee meeting.
- 14. (Lucy) Mission statement will be distributed to members for comment and discussion at the next meeting. By laws are necessary to further limit the broad nature of the statutes.

- 15. (Abdel) If you want to have by laws, then you must follow through with what they state. If they are not followed through, then chairman can establish some management guidelines.
- 16. (Lucy) I can email a copy of Pennsylvania's Advisory Committee's by laws to the members.
- 17. (Dermot) Once the by laws are finalized, we can forward them to the commissioner.
- 18. (Abdel) Should the Commissioner grant permission for the committee to go by the guidelines, then the committee can enforce by them such as if you miss a certain number of meetings you can be dismissed, set term limits.
- 19. (Phil Rusconi) NELAC Discussion Would the state accept third party audits?
- 20. (Jeff) No.
- 21. (Abdel) If NELAC is the future, then the committee should be looking into it now.
- 22. (Dermot) The state is not showing interest due to a lack of funding.
- 23. (Jeff) Steps that must be taken before CT can undertake NELAC
- Statutes must be put in place
- Additional staff would be necessary due to the two year inspection cycle
- Proficiency Testing will be increased to two times per year
 Due to these burdens, the state is not showing any interest.
- 24. (Abdel) We need to give a statement as a committee stating our position on this subject.
- 25. (Lucy) I believe that if an instate laboratory has NELAC approval then the state should accept that also.
- 26. (Jeff) This would inhibit DPH's ability to regulate laboratories. If you are an out of state lab, then current regulations accept reciprocity of the other state's program.
- 27. (Phil Rusconi) Is there any way authority to create a different inspection structure.
- 28. (Jeff) The state already has a different schedule of compliance. There is a three-year cycle for inspections and only one set of PT sample requirement.
- 29. (Dermot) Fees would have to be added to cover costs.
- 30. (Abdel) We need to draft a letter summarizing the committee's findings and defining the DPH's position on NELAC.
- 31. (Phil Rusconi) *Preservation of Soil Samples* DEP's limits and standards are based on unpreserved soil samples. If methanol is used, you will extract organics and you won't have standards to compare to.
- 32. (Bert) EPA Region I recommends preservation though RCRA states unpreserved samples should be used.
- 33. (Dermot) The DPH issued procedures for Drinking Water sampling and testing. Maybe one can be done for soils.
- 34. (Jeff) Since the testing is for the DEP, the DPH can send a letter recommending that they follow EPA guidelines for the preservation of soil samples for volatiles.
- 35. (Phil Rusconi) Nomination of New Members
- Commissioner must appoint new members
- A total of seven resumes were reviewed and categorized.

- Four positions are still open; two for public water utilities, one for inorganic specialist, one for organic specialist.
- Committee voted on applicants based on qualifications and geographical location.
- The two nominees are Kevin Miller for organic specialist and Barbara Obert for inorganic specialist.
- Motion to accept the two nominations. Motion accepted.

New Business

- 37. (Bert) Volunteered to begin a letter introducing the committee and send it to the Bureau Chiefs.
- 38. (Kim) Our mission statement should be included.
- 39. (Bert) It will also include members names and emails.
- 40. (Phil Rusconi) Members should forward to me names of people who should receive the introduction letter.
- 41. (Jeff) The Attorney General has been actively with a couple of cases involving laboratories engaged in fraudulent practices.
