

# **SAFER CHOICE** for Child Care Centers

### What is the Safer Choice label?

When you see a product with the Safer Choice label, it means that *every ingredient* in the product has been evaluated by EPA scientists. Only the safest ingredients are allowed in products with the Safer Choice label.

## Safer Choice for Child Care Centers

Why choose Safer Choice-labeled products?

- Children are more vulnerable to toxic chemicals because their bodies are still growing and developing.
- Children breathe more air for their size compared to adults.
- Children absorb harmful chemicals through their skin more quickly than adults because their skin is less protective than adults' skin.
- Children's skin touches the ground when they crawl and play where harmful chemicals collect.
- Children can have more exposure to environmental toxins because they put their hands, toys, and other objects in their mouths.
- Fragrances can be allergy and asthma triggers for children. If a product qualifies for the Safer Choice label and does not use any fragrance material, the program will allow the manufacturer to add "Fragrance-Free" to the Safer Choice label.

Note: Child care centers need to abide by their state-specific child care facilities regulations governing acceptable sanitizers and disinfectants.
