RE: Family Campground Registration and Inspections

As the warmer weather approaches, and spring/summer activities get underway, the Department of Public Health (DPH), Recreation Program, would like to remind all Local Health Departments and Districts that the Regulations of CT State Agencies (RCSA), Section 19a-2a-29 (c) (1) requires that by April 30 all family campgrounds "shall register annually in writing with the local director of health". This registration shall include "the name and location of the family campground, the name, address, and telephone number of the person responsible for the daily operations at the facility, the number of campsite unit sites, and the expected dates of operation". In addition, the RCSA, Section 19a-2a-29 (c) (2) requires that "the local director of health or his or her authorized agent shall inspect annually each family campground." A family campground is defined by the RCSA, Section 19a-2a-29 (b) (6) as "any location, property, parcel or tract of land under the control of any person, organization, or municipality that contains two or more camping unit sites for use by the public or members of an organization for overnight stays".
