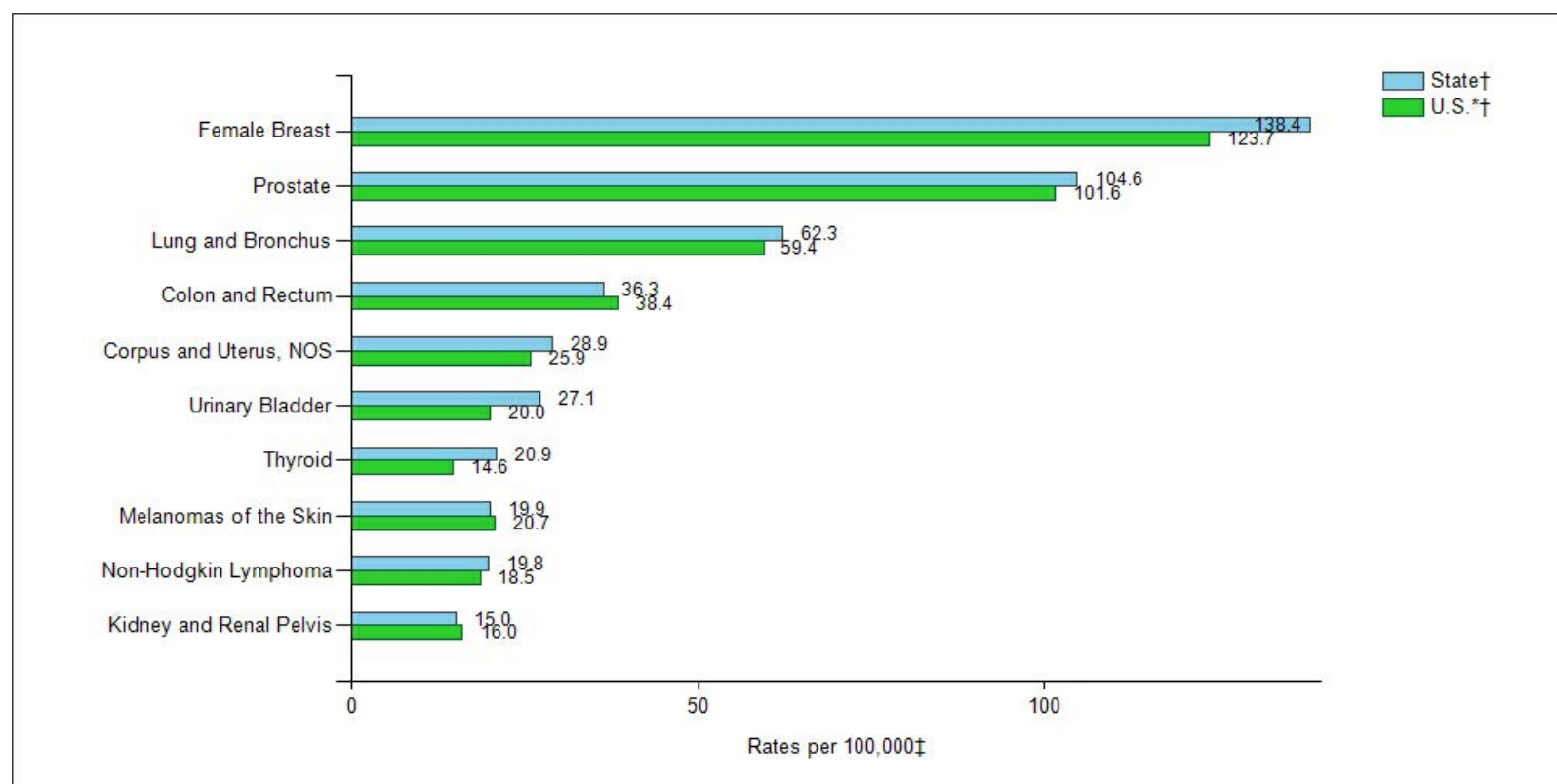


## Incidence Rates

In 2013, 1,559,130 new cancer cases were diagnosed in the United States\*, including 20,510 in Connecticut.

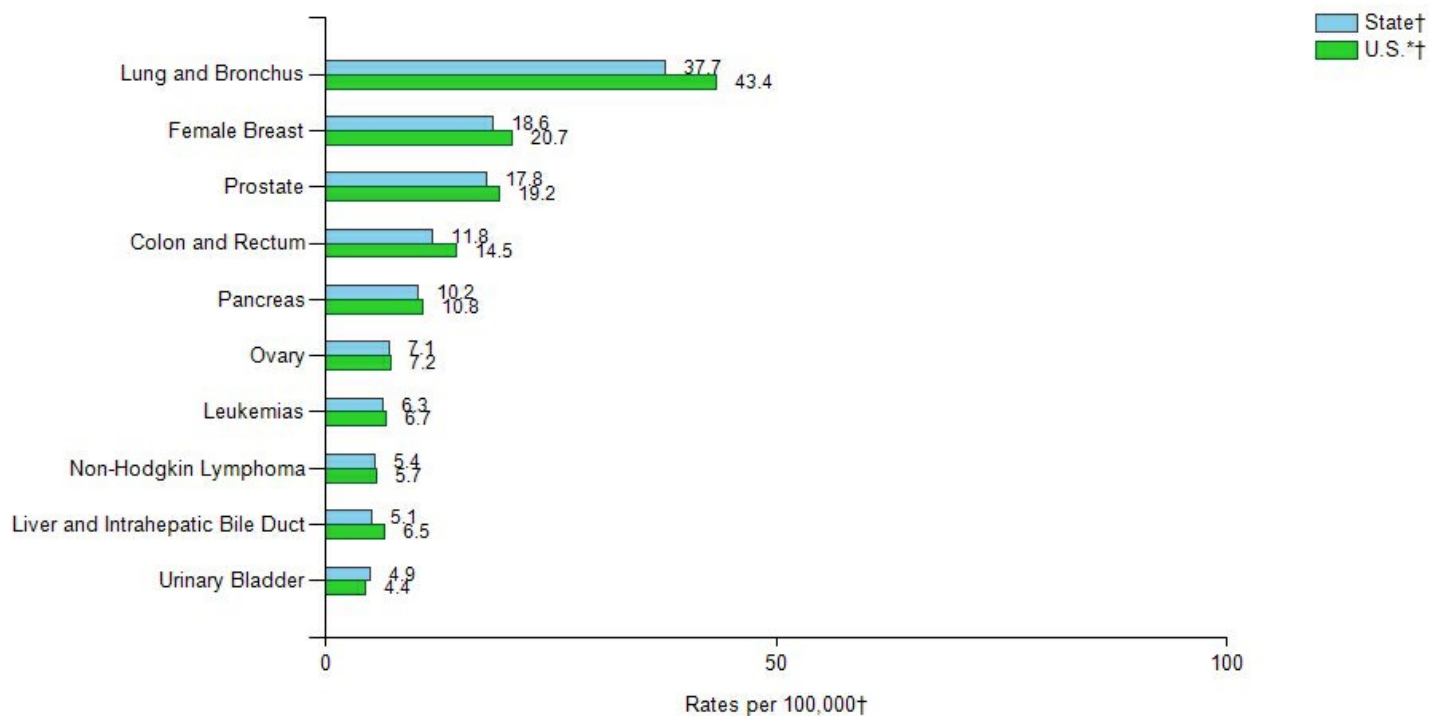
