Action Agenda	<p><b>Fall Prevention –</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Department on Aging has shared the most recent report from the <i>CT Collaboration for Fall Prevention</i>, which identified the specific communities and the services currently being implemented. DPH provided a listing of LHD receiving PHHSBG funds to conduct fall prevention programming.</li> <li>This initial data collection was a good start; however, the group thought that there should be a more comprehensive outreach to identify programs not included under the two grant sources. Members thought the best way to reach municipalities was through CCM.</li> <li>NEXT STEPS:               <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Finalize survey monkey and intro blurb;</li> <li>Ask CCM to send link to their members (members suggested to wait to distribute until after the legislative session);</li> <li>Give two week response time with a reminder sent one week prior to deadline.</li> <li>Team will set a follow up call prior to survey deadline TBD</li> </ol> </li> </ul> <p><b>Motor Vehicle –</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Phyllis has provided updated action items and time frames for 2017 Action Agenda. 2017 will focus on distracted driving, impaired driving, speeding, and unrestrained driving. Phyllis will send QU1 progress updates.</li> </ul> <p><b>Suicide Prevention –</b></p>	<p><b>-Judy</b> will contact the CT Conference of Municipalities (CCM) about sending out the fall prevention survey.</p> <p><b>-Kevin</b> will edit the survey blurb then send to Judy, Sandy and Michael on 5/4 (by end of day)</p> <p><b>-Sandy</b> will send the survey monkey link to Judy by the end of May.</p> <p><b>-Andrea</b> will write-up a justification on why the</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lindsey and Andrea have worked on updating the action items in the 2017 action agenda. Their updates are included in the document that is posted on the coalition website.</li> <li>• Nine organizations have adopted the Zero Suicide Protocol Model.</li> <li>• The group talked about refining the targets for Suicide in the SHIP. The process the group need to follow includes: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Documenting the proposed change and providing an explanation as to why the change was needed and the basis for how the new target was determined.</li> <li>2. This request is shared with the SHIP Advisory Council for their feedback.</li> <li>3. The Executive Committee then provides input before the change is finalized.</li> </ol> </li> </ul> <p><b>Sexual Violence –</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lindsey has worked on refining strategies in the action agenda.</li> <li>• The theme of Sexual Assault Awareness Month (SAAM) which was last month (April) was <i>Engaging New Voices</i>. The WDYS CT campaign, Connecticut’s first state-wide sexual violence prevention campaign was rebranded including three new poster/postcards of CT men, billboards, and GeoFencing ads surrounding five universities. The billboards ran on I-91 in Hartford and New Haven and on I-84 in Waterbury from April 10<sup>th</sup> through May 7<sup>th</sup>, and after two weeks there were over 500 unique hits from the GeoFencing ads (more data to come after the completion of the billboard run time).</li> <li>2. The WDYS CT webpage has been updated to include information about a public training for men only to be held on May 23rd (See ‘Events’ below for more information).</li> <li>3. Programs are performing a full evaluation of the WDYS CT Prevention Trainings being held on all college campuses in CT, including trainings of male athletes.</li> </ol> </li> <li>• All nine rape crisis centers have been trained on <i>Safe Dates Curriculum</i>. They will begin offering it to middle and high schools this fall, along with a thorough evaluation. They may try to pilot at a few camps or youth organizations this summer.</li> </ul> <p><b>May 23<sup>rd</sup> Advisory Council Meeting –</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In preparation for the Advisory Council meeting members discussed their current successes. One success has been through the falls prevention initiative, the team’s has started to engage new partners to identify gaps in services, as well as leveraging existing networks to brainstorm strategies that would begin to address those gaps with existing resources.</li> </ul> <p><b>Events –</b></p>	<p>targets in the action agenda should be changed.</p> <p><b>Lindsey</b> will forward a link to the team on the upcoming male only bystander intervention training being held on May 23<sup>rd</sup>.</p>

<b>2017 SHIP Policy Agenda Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Dept. of Transportation included language on seatbelts and motorcycle helmets in their proposed HB 7055; however, when the bill was passed favorable out of committee with substitute language, both the seatbelts and motorcycle helmets were removed from the version of the bill that moved forward. These were the two legislative issues proposed by the IVP Action Team for the 2017 SHIP Policy Agenda.
