Federal Grant Updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SAMHSA – Partnership for Success 2015 –This update focused on the subcontractor Institute for Community Research and the West Hartford Prevention Partnership, the risk factors that they are mitigating and the strategies being utilized. Other PFS grantees continue to implement prevention strategies, create and disseminate program information. SEOW meetings continue quarterly and a young adult survey is preparing for launch. • CDC - Prescription Drug Overdose Grant – The 3-year cycle of this grant is concluding on August 31st. Data is currently being collected and a competitive bid is being prepared for January 1st for anticipated CDC funds which combines 3 current and previous grants. Local health districts/ departments and community coalitions will be eligible applicants. • SAMHSA - Strategic Prevention Framework for Prescription Drugs - The 4 health districts funded under this initiative are well underway with their activities to raise awareness about the dangers of prescribing, sharing and using opioids. They are currently set to implement an Academic Detailing pilot that provides education and materials to physicians and pharmacists about opioids and the PDMP. • SAMHSA – State Opioid Response – Attendees were instructed to visit the SOR web page for latest updates on the funded projects. • SAMHSA – ASSERT –The ASSERT Treatment Model (ATM) is currently being implemented in 4 locations. There will be a link to the LiveLOUD campaign and an effort to have a youth voice represented.
