2020 Legislative Session Preview

The 2020 regular legislative session kicks off on Wednesday, February 5 and will continue through midnight on Wednesday, May 6. At noon, Governor Lamont presented his 'State of the State' outlining budget priorities, legislative goals and any proposed changes to the biennial budget passed last year. His address is available on the <u>CT General Assembly (CGA) website</u>.

During the proceedings, each chamber came to order, and acknowledged the three new members of the House of Representatives. The Speaker of the House and President Pro-Tempore of the Senate addressed their respective chambers.
