Transporting Hemp in Connecticut

Whenever hemp is in transit, the licensed grower is required to keep the following documents with the hemp crop at all times.

- 1. A copy of the grower license
- 2. A certificate of analysis showing the sample to have a THC concentration at or below threetenths (0.3) percent on a dry weight basis

Those documents must be available for inspection upon the request of the commissioner or any law enforcement agency.

Transporting Hemp Samples to the Laboratory for Analysis

Hemp samples being transported to laboratories shall be contained in a sealed tamper proof package and accompanied by the Department approved completed chain of custody form for hemp samples. A copy of the grower license must also be present. The hemp sample label shall contain at a minimum:

- The date and time the sample was collected
- Licensee name
- Licensee number
- Location where sample originated
- Identification of the lot the sample represents
- And a sample identification number or laboratory accession number

Hemp samples delivered to a laboratory via a delivery service such as FedEx, UPS or USPS must contain the above information and forms with the sample(s), and comply with any special labeling/packaging requirements the service requires.
