The above captioned matter was heard as a contested case on June 12, 1980, at which time the complainant and the respondents appeared, stipulated to certain facts, and presented testimony, exhibits, and argument on the complaint.

After consideration of the entire record, the following facts are found:

- 1. The respondents are public agencies as defined by § 1-18a(a), G.S.
- 2. On January 27, 1980, the complainant wrote to respondent director and to an OSHA compliance office requesting copies of any documents they used to conclude, in prior statements, that the New Britain Civil Service Commission changed its disciplinary procedures in April 1979.
- 3. The complainant received no response to either letter prior to February 5, 1980.
- 4. On June 12, 1980, the respondents tendered to the plaintiff a copy of a memorandum dated April 10, 1979, written by Walter McCusker, Acting Personnel Director of the City of New Britain.
- 5. There was insufficient evidence to establish that the respondents maintain any documents other than the McCusker memorandum from which they concluded that the disciplinary procedures of the New Britain Civil Service Commission changed in April, 1979.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above captioned complaint:

1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
