The above-captioned matter was heard as a contested case on January 9, 2017, at which time the complainant and the respondents appeared, stipulated to certain facts, and presented testimony, exhibits and argument on the complaint. The complainant, who is incarcerated, appeared via teleconference, pursuant to the January 2004 memorandum of understanding between the Commission and the Department of Correction. See Docket No. CV 03-0826293, *Anthony Sinchak v. FOIC et al*, Superior Court, J.D. of Hartford at Hartford, Corrected Order dated January 27, 2004 (Sheldon, J.).

After consideration of the entire record, the following facts are found and conclusions of law are reached:

- 1. The respondents are public agencies within the meaning of §1-200(1), G.S.
- 2. By letter of complaint filed August 22, 2016, the complainant appealed to the Commission, alleging that the respondents violated the Freedom of Information ("FOI") Act by failing to comply with his August 6, 2016 request to review or copy certain public records.
- 3. It is found that the complainant made an August 6, 2016 request to the respondents to review the Americans with Disabilities Act ("ADA") certification for a particular counselor supervisor employed by the respondents, and the ADA training curriculum to become an ADA coordinator.
- 4. It is found that the respondents replied on November 22, 2016 that there were no existing documents.

- 5. It is found that the respondents' training for ADA coordinators consists of quarterly guest speakers, and that there is no set curriculum to become an ADA coordinator.
 - 6. It is found that certifications are not issued to ADA coordinators.
 - 7. Section 1-200(5), G.S., defines "public records" as follows:

Public records or files means any recorded data or information relating to the conduct of the public's business prepared, owned, used, received or retained by a public agency, ...whether such data or information be handwritten, typed, tape-recorded, printed, photostated, photographed or recorded by any other method.

8. Section 1-210(a), G.S., provides, in relevant part:

Except as otherwise provided by any federal law or state statute, all records maintained or kept on file by any public agency, whether or not such records are required by any law or by any rule or regulation, shall be public records and every person shall have the right to (1) inspect such records promptly during regular office or business hours, (2) copy such records in accordance with subsection (g) of section 1-212, or (3) receive a copy of such records in accordance with section 1-212.

- 9. It is found that there are no public records responsive to the complainant's request.
- 10. It is therefore concluded that the respondents did not violate the FOI Act as alleged.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above-captioned complaint:

1. The complaint is dismissed
