The above-captioned matter was scheduled to be heard as a contested case on February 23, 2018 at 1:00 PM, at which time the respondents appeared with their counsel, but the complainant did not appear to prosecute the case.

The hearing officer notes that Attorney Carl T. Landolina, counsel for the respondents, appeared at the hearing with his witness, Chief of Police Eric Osanitsch. Attorney Landolina represented that, prior to the hearing, he had spent approximately two hours examining the file, speaking with the Commission's ombudsman and preparing for the hearing with Chief Osanitsch.

The hearing officer further notes that Attorney Landolina and Chief Osanitsch both traveled from Windsor Locks to Hartford and arrived on time for the contested case hearing, only to have a two minute hearing and travel back to Windsor Locks

It is difficult to understand why, with all of the available means of technology, the complainant failed to notify the Commission that the hearing was not necessary.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above-captioned complaint:

- 1. The complaint is hereby dismissed with prejudice.
- 2. The complainant is admonished for his failure to appear at the hearing in this matter, which failure resulted in a waste of scarce state and local resources.
