Chairman Lawlor announced that the Prison Population Indicators Report is finished and should be out soon. Chairman Lawlor highlighted that February 2013 had the lowest number of arrests statewide as far back as record can show. In 2012, the arrest rate dropped 12%, in 2011, 8%; this shows a decline in the number of arrests that is seen as positive for the state. The number of people being released from prisons is also down, as well as the number of people being sentenced to prison.

X. Agency Updates

<u>Chief State's Attorney</u> – Chief State's Attorney Kevin Kane discussed the nature of the criminal investigation being conducted regarding the crimes in Newtown. He recognizes that this investigation continues because the affected families and citizens have the right to have law enforcement investigate all leads and look at all evidence. The atmosphere around this investigation must be calm and thorough. The investigation has been kept confidential thus far but it will be released so that the public can receive accurate answers.

XI. Behavioral Health Sub-Committee

There will be a meeting next week. There is a complication that impact the agencies in CJPAC, an action of American Psychiatric Association which changes the concept of alcohol and substance consumption statutes to determine whether someone is dependent on alcohol or substances. A bill that is currently being

considered by the legislature, HB 6644, offered some suggestions about modifying the language. New concept is that dependence is just a continuum of severity. Dependence will be a moderate or severe use disorder. Probably have to begin using the terminology. New definitions might require other modifications.
