# SUPERVISED DIVERSIONARY PROGRAM

### **BACKGROUND**

- 54-561 (Effective Oct. 1, 2008): Created a diversionary program that combines mental health treatment with probation supervision for defendants with psychiatric disabilities.
- Psychiatric disability is defined as a mental or emotional condition, other than solely substance abuse, that has substantial adverse effects on the defendant's ability to function and requires care and treatment \*

\* Per CGS 54-561

### **OVERVIEW OF ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

- Defendant must be amenable to treatment and supervision (CSSD)
- Not more than 1 prior use of the SDP (CSSD)
- Excluded charges are consistent with provision set forth in the statute pertaining to Pretrial Accelerated Rehabilitation, 54-56e sub. (c) (CSSD) -- \*crimes or violations are not of a serious nature.
- Client found to have a psychiatric disability who would benefit from treatment. (CSSD will refer to appropriate provider – can be CSSD's Contracted Provider)

## **ELIGIBILITY**

- The mental health provider will determine if the defendant has a psychiatric disability requiring treatment
- The provider will provide treatment recommendations for all eligible clients
- CSSD staff will inform the court of the eligibility status/recommendations for treatment
