




Between <u>2010 and 2013</u> delinquency referrals of youth under the age of 16 declined by 34%. It declined 29% for 16-year olds.






Confined juveniles


Summertime pre-trial population



- The state's pre-trial prison population rises during the summertime. In recent years, however, the number of pretrial prisoners held in prison has been trending downward, as have the number of statewide criminal arrests.
- The number of pre-trial prisoners incarcerated on September 1, 2014 (3,553) was the lowest September 1st total since 2003 when 3,550 pre-trial detainees were incarcerated.
