Number of Taser Reports

- ■There were 575 taser reports involving 542 people. (2015: 650 reports involving 610 people)
- ■80 departments submitted EDW reports: (2015: 79 departments)
 - 76 were municipal police departments
 - 3 were special police departments
 - Connecticut State Police
 - 18 departments reported no incidents involving an EDW
- •Average number of reports is seven per department (2015: 8 per department)
 - 51 departments reported fewer than 5
 - 14 reported between 5 and 10
 - 15 reported more than 10

Taser Subject Demographics

- -37 persons under 18 were involved in a taser incident (2015: 22 persons under 18)
 - 13 of them were tased (8 black, 2 white, 3 Hispanic)
 - 6 of the youth tased were reported as emotionally disturbed or suicidal
 - A 13 year old was tased 4 times
 - All youth under 16 were black, though only one was tased
 - Youngest person to have been involved in a taser incident was 7 years old

Approximately 55% of people (300) involved in taser incidents were tased

Armed vs. Unarmed Persons

- ■80% of all people involved in taser incidents were unarmed
- •30% of all armed persons tased were suicidal
- Less than 7% of all persons involved in a taser incident were armed and threatened to use the weapon

Taser Incidents Involving Emotionally Disturbed or Suicidal Persons

 Approximately 38% of persons involved in reported taser incidents were described as emotionally disturbed. (33% in 2015)

Taser Incidents Involving Emotionally Disturbed or Suicidal Persons

- •11% of reported taser incidents involved persons described as suicidal
- Suicidal persons were much more likely to be armed
 - 54% were armed compared to 15% of non-suicidal persons

Taser Incidents involving Intoxicated Persons

- •44% of persons involved in taser incidents were identified as "under the influence of alcohol/drugs"
 - These persons were more likely to be tased than average (60%)

Type of Resistance that Resulted in Taser Use

- •Unarmed, but threatened used of weapon (11)
- Threat/Hostile (202)
- Unarmed Assault (55)
- Fighting Stance/Combative (199)
- •Fleeing (181)
- Dead Weight/ non-compliant (52)
- Failed to follow officers directions (213)

Multiple Taser Deployments

•55% of persons tased only received one shock

Injuries Resulting from Tasers

Subject Injuries Reported

- 162 probe puncture injuries (266 cartridge deployments)
- 78 abrasions
- 38 "other"
- 26 bruises
- 5 experienced breathing difficulties
- 1 lost consciousness

Officer Injuries Reported

- 20 bruises
- 29 abrasions
- 1 probe puncture
- 6 breathing difficulty
- 29 "other"

Summary of Findings

- Use of tasers by police appears to be under-reported
- •The vast majority of taser incidents involved males (93%)
- •Minority persons account for 56% of all taser incidents
- •37 persons under the age of 18 were involved in a taser incident
- •Of the 542 people involved in a taser incident, 300 (55%) received and electric shock
- **80%** of persons involved in taser incidents were unarmed
 - Black males were less likely than white or Hispanic males to be armed
- •38% of persons involved in taser incidents were described as emotionally disturbed
- •11% of persons involved in taser incidents were suicidal
- •44% of persons involved in taser incidents were under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- •45% of persons tased received more than one shock

Recommendations

- 1. Improve Data Collection Form
- 2. Clarify reporting practices
- 3. Collect use-of-force and case incident reports for all taser incidents
- 4. Additional research on persons experiencing psychiatric crisis
- 5. Collect data on other use-of force incidents
