To enhance the Secretary of the State's CONCORD business filing system to accommodate the framework for a new, legislatively mandated entity, the "benefit LLC". A benefit LLC, like the existing benefit corporation, both pursues social benefits and increases value. Benefit LCCs provide the tax and ease-of-use benefit of the LLC and the marketing, accountability and transparency benefits of the benefit corporation. Benefit LLCs will enable people to include social entrepreneurship as part of their mission and provide an incentive to invest in such businesses in Connecticut.
