## CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM – DAY CARE HOME PROVIDERS

(HARTFORD, CT) – Many local day care home providers in Connecticut participate in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) and provide nutritious meals to more than 4,500 children daily at approximately 915 locations statewide under the sponsorship of seven local and statewide sponsoring organizations. Under this program, nutritious meals and/or snacks are provided at no separate charge to all enrolled participants.
