Regional School Choice Fair This Saturday

First fair kicks off 2015-16 Regional School Choice Office (RSCO) lottery application period

(HARTFORD, CT) – November 10, 2014 -- Want to explore the many great opportunities for your child's education within the Greater Hartford region? Want to speak with staff and families that work or attend a magnet school and the Hartford Region Open Choice Program? Bring the family to the first of four regional school choice fairs on Saturday, November 15, 2014 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at A.I. Prince Technical High School, 401 Flatbush Avenue, Hartford.

The fair will feature booths and information about the wide array of programming options available to Hartford and suburban students entering grades PK-12. Parents, grandparents, guardians and students can speak with helpful staff from RSCO and its partners, the Capitol Region Education Council, Hartford Public Schools' Host Magnet Program, Hartford Region Open Choice districts, Goodwin College, the Connecticut Technical High School System, Bloomfield Public Schools and East Hartford Public Schools.

If you are new to this experience, there will be a video presentation to provide an overview of the RSCO lottery application process. After viewing the presentation, RSCO staff will be available to answer specific questions.

Families will also have the option of submitting an online application for the 2015-16 RSCO lottery. The 2015-16 lottery application period opens on Saturday, November 15, 2014 and closes on Friday, February 27, 2015. The lottery is not first-come, first-served, and families are encouraged to make an informed decision.

"Our goal is to provide information and improve access for students throughout the region who choose to apply to public schools outside of their community," said Glen Peterson, RSCO's Division Director. "Through our four fairs held between November and February, as well as many other school- and program-based open houses and information sessions scheduled, families can learn about the schools and specialized programs in our region that emphasize exciting educational themes."
