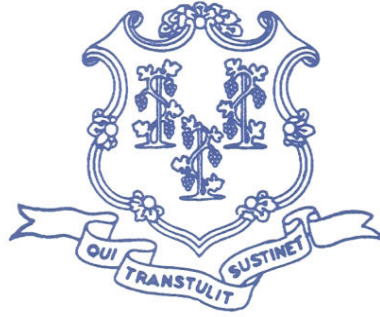

## Official Statement

*W*HEREAS, public awareness of the hazards of inexperienced and/or alcohol impaired driving has been increased through the collaborative efforts of state government and national organizations including the Governor's Highway Safety Association and the National Association of Women Highway Safety Leaders; and

*W*HEREAS, the people of the State of Connecticut appreciate the local citizen activist groups such as Mourning Parents Act, Inc. (!MPACT) and the Connecticut Teen Driving Safety Partnership who help to promote teen driver safety; and

*W*HEREAS, motor vehicle accidents are the leading cause of death for United States teens, accounting for thirty-six percent of all deaths in that age group; and

*W*HEREAS, in 2005, approximately 400,000 teenagers incurred nonfatal injuries due to motor vehicle accidents; and

*W*HEREAS, teens make up ten percent of the United States population and twelve percent of all motor vehicle deaths in 2005 involved teen drivers; and

*W*HEREAS, the suffering caused by inexperienced and/or impaired driving touches the lives of countless families and the needless emotional anguish from these tragedies far exceeds any dollar amount associated with crashes and fatalities; and

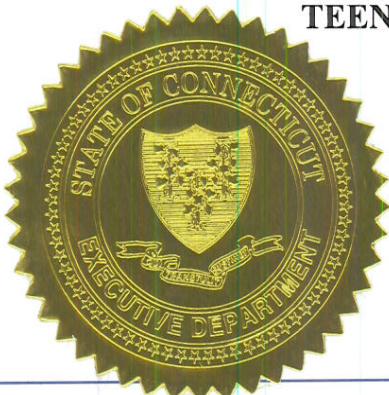
*W*HEREAS, every individual must make a strong commitment to ensure safe and cautious driving practices by new, young drivers who may be too inexperienced behind the wheel to avoid accidents; and

*W*HEREAS, Mourning Parents Act, Inc. has developed a teen driver safety program for teens and parents throughout Connecticut to spread awareness and information on safe driving practices; now
