HART Update	Data: 114 Referrals through June 2018. Since 2008, close to 1,000 referrals for high risk or confirmed child victims. 66% of the youth live at home at the time of referral. This dispels the myth that these are youth in foster care and congregate care. There is a need to educate youth that are not in the care. Trainings over the last 6-months: 100 trainings and reached almost 2,000 participants. There have been six TOTs to increase the capacity for these trainings in Connecticut this year alone. System Gaps and Barriers	Waiting for statewide data in order to move forward with some additional agenda items/recommendations for the workgroup to continue its work. Distribution of survey results that was sent to the MDT/CAC around treatment resources for youth with problem sexual behavior(PSB). GTF membership will review materials shared and a revised document to be provided for a 20-minute discussion at the next GTF meeting. OVS – Many providers around the state applied for OVS grant money. Application was due in July with an expected award date in September and implementation in January. These funds would have addressed some of the gaps in the state around child victims for physical and sexual abuse. There is a delay around the award date as well the date for implementation is now July 1, 2019.	
Training	At the last training committee meeting, Beth Leaming was appointed as Co-Chair for the committee. Her name was presented for consideration to the full task force. In anticipation of approval, the co-chairs met last week to discuss committee members, structure, and governance including possible by-laws, future trainings and timeline for finalizing current training updates. Finding Words – The last training occurred last week. The evaluation and feedback were good for the week. The new chairs were present during the week-long training. The new chairs will be meeting to discuss the training moving forward. A plaque was presented to Steve Sedensky for his work with Finding Words. Minimal Facts – Finalizing the curriculums and looking to roll it out in 2019 and will take in to consideration the roll out of other GTF committee tools and reports. Are we having the right conversations?; Sexual v Physical v Child Deaths and how we can reduce these numbers; Compare the numbers of child maltreatment victims in the state and how many of these are being served by the teams; What works well and what does not work well as identified by the teams; Gaps and policy issues that affect the best practice response for the kids across the state; Present some of the work being done at Yale and highlight some of the challenges in working in some of the communities; Data – set what we have as the minimum to consider cases and have an agreed upon language; Direct Services for Children – Yale and Klingberg will present; PSB Youth in Connecticut; CFSR - March by DCF; The parent perspective and prosecution perspective on cases; and, What does child abuse look like in the state of Connecticut? You can google Child Maltreatment 2016 and receive a report that looks at each state regarding this issue.
